Elsipogtog First Nation	Elsipogtog Victim Services Program - The Elsipogtog victim service program offers culturally appropriate and specific services to Aboriginal victims within the Elsipogtog community. Additionally, it serves clients coming out of the Healing to Wellness court. It employs one Victim Services Coordinator that works in the Elsipogtog community and partners closely with the Restorative Justice and Healing to Wellness programs.
Elsipogtog First Nation	Elsipogtog Restorative Justice Program - The Elsipogtog Restorative Justice program offers culturally specific, out of court proceedings for community members. All clients are from the Elsipogtog community and are offered an opportunity to make amends in a traditional way to address the offence they had been involved in. Seeks to reconcile victims and offenders through the use of traditional sentencing circles and culturally appropriate services.

Other	Family Information Liaison Unit (FILU) - The FILU unit offers support for families of MMIWG. This outreach assists family members with culturally appropriate support as well as connecting the families of murdered and missing women and girls with the justice system. The 5-year pilot, scheduled to end March 31, 2023, was extended two more years.
Other	Aboriginal Outreach Program - Provides support and direct outreach services to women experiencing violence in three First Nation communities, greater Miramichi, living on and outside of the community. This 5-year pilot was well received and extended for 5 more years.
