## SCOPE OF THE OCCUPATION

The utility arborist occupation includes

- (a) the planning for the removal and pruning of woody plants and trees in proximity to energized electrical apparatuses and removing and pruning the plants and trees;
- (b) the climbing of trees and working at heights in proximity to energized electrical apparatuses;
- (c) the clearing of vegetation in proximity to energized electrical apparatuses;
- (d) the controlling of underbrush in proximity to energized electrical apparatuses;
- (e) the operating and maintaining of aerial devices and vegetation management equipment such as; chippers, chain saws, brush saws, pole saws, bucket trucks and skidders;
- (f) the hoisting and rigging of trees and limbs;
- (g) the application of pesticides/herbicides to woody plants and trees in proximity to energized electrical apparatuses;
- (h) the interpretation of documentation such as maps, charts, and work plans;
- (i) the identification of woody plants and trees species their decay and diseases;
- (j) the developing of good customer relations;
- (k) the response to emergency situations during power outages to clear downed trees off electrical infrastructure;
- (1) the emergency response planning, aerial rescue, bucket evacuation and extraction; and
- (m) the maintaining of a working knowledge of operating regulations, working clearances, and safety regulations.
