
Agriculture and Agri-Food 2007

The agriculture sector is diverse, combining 2,776 farms with 100 processing plants to produce \$1.17 billion worth of agri-food and beverage products making it an important component of a self-sufficient New Brunswick. This sector of our economy provides over 8,000 jobs in primary production and about 6,540 jobs in secondary packaging and processing activities. New Brunswick enjoys one of the highest levels of value-added processing in Canada from its agriculture sector and its agri-products, which are currently exported to approximately 80 countries. More than 80 percent of the province's agriculture production is processed before reaching the market. Potatoes, dairy products, eggs and poultry and Greenhouse & Floriculture account for close to 60 percent of New Brunswick's total farm income of \$444 million in 2007.







2007 Highlights

- Despite the currency exchange rates between Canada and the U.S. creating additional marketing challenges, Agrifood exports increased to a value of \$184 million, a rise of \$45.5 million from 2006, largely due to potato and potato product exports.
- Strawberries and blueberries enjoyed another good year in 2007. With four million pounds, the strawberry crop was one of the best ever harvested by New Brunswick strawberry growers. The wild blueberry crop production with a total of 26.1 million pounds was the largest New Brunswick blueberry crop ever harvested, surpassing the 2003 crop, when 24.1 million pounds were harvested.
- From the total production of 6.9 million pounds, over 3
 million pounds of cranberries were cleaned via the new
 receiving station in Bells Mills which was officially opened
 in October 2007. These cleaned berries were sold to the
 U.S. and Québec. The small portion of the crop that stays
 in New Brunswick gets processed into juice, wine,
 powders, and various other products.
- Poultry and dairy showed significant increases in 2007, adding a total of \$14 million to their previous farm cash receipts. These commodities clearly demonstrated the importance of their contribution to the province's overall agriculture sector in the past five years.
- Oats have seen its total production increase from 6,900 to 8,440 hectares in 2007. This increase of 22 percent is due to low disease pressure and strong commodity prices that have renewed producer interest in this crop.
