## **DOCUMENT "A"**

## MINISTER'S DETERMINATION CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act January 9, 2006 File Number: 4561-3-1052

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- 2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) Clean Environment Act again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment and Local Government.
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated September 26, 2005, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Director of the Project Assessment Branch of the Department of the Environment and Local Government (DELG) every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
- 4. Prior to importing the oil, the proponent shall test all shipments for flash point and for the parameters listed in Part II of Schedule A of the *Used Oil Regulation* under New Brunswick's <u>Clean Environment Act</u>. Shipments that do not meet the criteria for "used oil" as stated in the above noted Regulation shall not be accepted for processing and shall not be disposed of in New Brunswick. Test results shall be kept on file by the proponent and provided to the Approvals Branch, Department of Environment and Local Government on request.
- 5. The proponent shall ensure that the transporter of "used oil" within New Brunswick (as defined by New Brunswick's *Used Oil Regulation* under the <u>Clean Environment Act</u>) holds a valid Carrier Approval issued under the *Used Oil Regulation*. - 6. The proponent shall consult with the Approvals Branch, Department of Environment and Local Government, regarding the timing of any necessary amendments to the existing Approvals to Operate for the recycling facility at 637 Bayside Drive, Saint John and for the used oil transportation network.
