MINISTER'S DETERMINATION

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act February 27, 2007 File Number: 4561-3-1091

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- 2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) Clean Environment Act again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment.
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration documents dated August 21, 2006 and January 17, 2007, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Director of the Project Assessment Branch every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
- 4. Once the final route has been chosen for the transportation of the digesters, the proponent shall contact Susan Andrews-Caron, Director of the Policy Branch, New Brunswick Department of Transportation, at (506) 453-2802 to determine if any special transportation permits or other provisions may be required.
- 5. An Environmental Protection Plan (EPP) shall be developed which describes environmental protection measures to be implemented by the project workers and contractors during the construction phase of the project. The EPP must address the routine procedures for the management of site runoff, fuel and waste oils, lubricants and other hazardous materials, sanitary waste, and construction waste. The EPP must be submitted to the Director of the Project Assessment Branch, Department of Environment, prior to the commencement of any activities that could result in the discharge or loss of any harmful material or deleterious substance into a watercourse, or prior to any equipment operating near a watercourse.
