MINISTER'S DETERMINATION CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the Clean Environment Act December 12, 2008 File Number: 4561-3-1164

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- 2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period, the undertaking must be re-evaluated under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) Clean Environment Act, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment.
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document (dated August 11, 2008), as well as all those identified in all subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager of the Project Assessment Section of the Department of Environment (DENV) every six months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
- 4. If it is suspected that remains of archaeological significance are found during construction, all activity shall be stopped near the find and the Resource Manager of the Archaeological Services Unit, Heritage Branch of the Department of Wellness, Culture and Sport, shall be contacted at (506) 453-2756.
- 5. The proponent must obtain an Approval to Construct and Operate from the Project Assessment and Approvals Branch, DENV, before construction activities may be commenced. For more information, please contact the Director of the Project Assessment and Approvals Branch at (506) 444-4599.
- 6. Any results used to determine the treatment requirements of the wastewater must be provided for review to the Director of the Project Assessment and Approvals Branch of DENV.
