MINISTER'S DETERMINATION

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the <u>Clean Environment Act</u> **February 27, 2009**

File Number: 4561-03-1186

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- 2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) Clean Environment Act again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment.
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated November 4th, 2008, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager of the Project Assessment Section of the Department of Environment every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
- 4. The proponent must obtain a *Certificate of Approval (CoA) to Construct* for this facility, from the Stewardship Branch of the NB DENV, prior to beginning construction of the project. In addition, the proponent must obtain a *Certificate of Approval to Operate* for this facility prior to beginning operation.
- 5. All solids derived from the dewatering process must be disposed of at an approved composting or solid waste facility.
- 6. All supernatant (liquid waste) derived from the dewatering process must be directed to the Town of Woodstock waste water treatment plant via the municipal wastewater collection system.
- 7. The proponent must submit an odour complaint report (detailing any complaints received within the first year of operation) to the Manager, Project Assessment Section, within 60 days of the completion of the first year of operation of the facility, including mitigation options if necessary.
- 8. The proponent must submit an Environmental Management Plan to address environmental issues pertaining to facility construction, operation, decommissioning and reclamation. This must include but not be limited to an emergency response plan, groundwater monitoring plan, contingency plan, options in the event the Woodstock WWTP cannot accept the waste, etc. This must be submitted to the Manager, Project Assessment, within 30 days of the date of this Determination.
- 9. The proponent must inform the Department of Environment, Regional Office in Grand Falls at (506) 473-7744, no less than 5 days prior to the commencement of construction activity associated with this undertaking.
