MINISTER'S DETERMINATION

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL
Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the <u>Clean Environment Act</u>
April 12, 2011
File Number: 4561-3-1211

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) – <u>Clean Environment Act</u> again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment.
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated March 26, 2009 as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager of the Environmental Assessment Section of the Department of Environment every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
- 4. The Archaeological Services Unit, Heritage Branch, Wellness, Culture and Sport would require the reporting of anything of known or suspected heritage value immediately to Archaeological Services at 453-3014 as per the requirements of the <u>Heritage Conservation Act (2010)</u>. Archaeological Services would also require that work in the area of the find be stopped temporarily until such time as direction is received from Archaeological Services.
- 5. The proponent shall obtain an Approval to Construct and an Approval to Operate from the Impact Management Branch of the New Brunswick Department of Environment. The Approval to Construct shall be obtained prior to the commencement of any ground breaking construction activities. - 6. Details regarding the final design of the wastewater treatment system shall be submitted to the Impact Management Branch of the Department of Environment for approval prior to construction. Please contact Mr. Tim LeBlanc, Manager of the Water & Wastewater Management Section, at (506) 444-5194 for details.
- 7. The Draft Environmental Management Plan (EMP), dated April 12, 2010, shall be finalized to incorporate Technical Review Committee comments and the final document shall be submitted to the Manager, Environmental Assessment Section. Contractors working on the project shall also be made aware of the contents of the finalized EMP, and copies shall be made available at the site.
- 8. A detailed Plan (including an implementation schedule) to mitigate the effects of the loss of floodflow alteration, sediment/ toxicant retention, production export, and wildlife habitat, as identified during the EIA review, shall be submitted to the Manager of the Environmental Assessment Section by September 01, 2011. The approved Plan shall be implemented by December 2012.
