MINISTER'S DETERMINATION

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL
Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the <u>Clean Environment Act</u>
May 15, 2013
File Number: 4561-3-1349

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- 2. Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) Clean Environment Act again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment and Local Government.
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the documents entitled, "WAWA#33466,11" dated November 8, 2012 and "Long Lake Causeway Upgrade" dated January 10, 2013, as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Manager of the Environmental Assessment Section of the Department of Environment and Local Government (DELG) every 6 months from the date of this Determination until such a time as all the Conditions have been met.
- 4. Where the remains of the earlier causeway are a protected archaeological site under the <u>Heritage Conservation Act</u> (2010), all efforts should be made to minimize the impact to the existing structure; as such the proponent shall ensure that a geotextile fabric or other material approved by the Manager of the Environmental Assessment Section, DELG, is used to separate the existing causeway structure from any work related to the causeway upgrade.
- 5. Prior to commencement of the project, the proponent shall contact Mr. Terry Richard C.E.T Environmental Inspector, Regional Services, DELG, in Dieppe, NB at 506 856-2374.
- 6. The proponent must apply for and obtain a *Watercourse and Wetland Alteration (WAWA) Permit* from DELG for any activities conducted within 30 metres of a watercourse or wetland, prior to the commencement of the Project. For additional information, please contact the Manager of the Watercourse and Wetland Alteration Program, DELG, at (506) 457-4850.
- 7. The proponent shall ensure that if a nest or chick of a migratory bird is detected, work in the area shall be halted and Canadian Wildlife Service be consulted for advice ((902) 426 9152). The proponent shall ensure that activities are conducted in a manner that would be in compliance with the *Migratory Birds Convention Act*.
- 8. The proponent shall ensure that all spills are reported to the 24-hour Environmental Emergencies Reporting System: **1-800-565-1633**. This is a requirement of section 38 (5) of the *Fisheries Act*, as well as the notification regulations under the *Canadian Environmental Protection Act*.
