MINISTER'S DETERMINATION

CONDITIONS OF APPROVAL

Pursuant to Regulation 87-83 under the <u>Clean Environment Act</u> December 18, 2017 File Number: 4561-3-1458

- 1. In accordance with section 6(6) of the Regulation, it has been determined that the undertaking may proceed following approval under all other applicable acts and regulations.
- Commencement of this undertaking must occur within three years of the date of this Determination. Should commencement not be possible within this time period the undertaking must be registered under the *Environmental Impact Assessment Regulation* (87-83) – <u>Clean Environment Act</u> again, unless otherwise stated by the Minister of Environment and Local Government.
- 3. The proponent shall adhere to all obligations, commitments, monitoring and mitigation measures presented in the EIA registration document dated March 2017 as well as all those identified in subsequent correspondence during the registration review. Additionally, the proponent shall submit a summary table detailing the status of each Condition listed in this Determination to the Director of the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) Branch of the Department of Environment and Local Government (DELG) every six months from the date of this Determination until such a time as the Director determines it is no longer required.
- 4. If it is suspected that remains of archaeological significance are discovered during construction, operation, or maintenance of the proposed development, as per the New Brunswick Heritage Conservation Act, (2010) all activity shall be stopped near the find and the Manager of the Archaeological Regulatory Unit, Archaeological Services Branch, New Brunswick Department of Tourism, Heritage and Culture, shall be contacted at (506) 238-3512 for further direction.
- 5. A Groundwater and Surface Water Monitoring Program must be submitted for review and must receive approval from the Director of DELG's EIA Branch prior to the start of any project-related construction activities. The Program must also include a plan for the decommissioning of any on-site monitoring wells that will not be used as part of the Program. Any such wells must be decommissioned as per the attached DELG "Guidelines for the Decommissioning (Abandonment) of Water Wells." - 6. An *Approval to Construct* must be obtained from DELG prior to the start of any construction activities related to this project. For more information, please contact DELG's Authorizations & Compliance Branch at (506) 453-7945.
- 7. An Approval to Operate must be obtained from DELG prior to the start of any wood waste disposal activities. For more information, please contact DELG's Authorizations & Compliance Branch at (506) 453-7945.
- 8. In the event of the sale, lease, or any other conveyance or change of control of the property, or any portion thereof, the proponent must provide written acknowledgement from the lessee, controller, or purchaser confirming that they will comply with the Conditions of this Determination to the Director of DELG's EIA Branch.
- 9. The proponent must ensure that all developers, contractors, and operators associated with the construction and operation of the project comply with the above.
