

Subprovincial Areas Struggle to Keep Population

- Only five of 15 counties in the province reported population gains between 2001 and 2006: Westmorland, York, Albert, Kings and Kent, although growth in Kent County was minimal (+0.2%).
- There were 103 municipalities (cities, towns and villages) defined in New Brunswick at the time of the 2006 Census; 73 showed a decline in population from 2001 while 30 showed an increase.
- Of New Brunswick's eight cities, three gained population over the five-year period: Moncton (up 5.0% to 64,128), Fredericton (up 6.2% to 50,535) and Dieppe (up 24.2% to 18,565).
- All 20 Indian reserves in the province participated in the 2006 Census.
