

SCOPE OF THE OCCUPATION

The lather (interior systems mechanic) occupation includes

- (a) the planning and scheduling of work;
- (b) the preparing of the worksite;
- (c) the diagnosing and repairing of any problems relating to lather-interior systems;
- (d) the interpreting of blueprints, shop drawings and specifications;
- (e) the installing of drywall, metal lath and stucco wire;
- (f) the cutting, preparing, and fabricating of all lath materials;
- (g) the installing of access flooring systems;
- (h) the erecting of non-load and load bearing steel assemblies;
- (i) the installing of wall systems and components;
- (j) the installing of ceiling systems;
- (k) the installing of sound barriers and lead radiation shielding;
- (l) the installing of smoke and fire barriers;
- (m) the installing of insulation and membranes; and
- (n) the preparing and installing of material for exterior finishes.
